

Technical Evaluation Criteria



S.	Section	Quantitative criteria
1	Company Experience	Over <u>10</u> years of experience in exploration and exploitation of mining license areas (max score).
2	Teamwork Knowledge Power	Over <u>100</u> years of cumulative relevant experience in mining exploitation and exploration by the company's team members [Technical team and HSE professionals] (max score).
3	Current Gold Reserve or Resources Position	Over <u>10 million</u> ounces of proven gold ore reserves or demonstrated resources (max score). Bidder must provide proof of proven gold ore reserves or demonstrated resources more than 1 million ounces.
4	Annual Gold Production	Over 500,000 ounces of annual attributable gold production (max score).
5	Exploration plan	The technical exploration program designed for first exploration phases in addition to a detailed plan for the first year of the first exploration phases.

☐ Specific weighting is applied to each Technical category (8 points for each).



Financial Evaluation Criteria



• Financial solvency for the last (3) years: The bidder shall submit a certified copy of the company annual report for the last three years.

1	The financial commitment for the exploration phase	Financial commitment to be spent during the three (3) exploration phases.
2	Shalateen percentage of production	Shalateen percentage of production after royalty, cost recovery percentage and EMRA percentage.
3	Bonuses (competitive)	 Signature Bonus Before signing the Exploration & exploitation contract. Assignment bonus during Exploration & exploitation. Training bonus during Exploration & exploitation Phases.
